Daniel J. Swartling is from Winona, Minnesota. He graduated with a BS degree in chemistry in 1985 from Winona State University. He then moved to Grand Forks, North Dakota to attend the University of North Dakota, graduating with a PhD in chemistry in 1989. He was a research assistant in the department of medicinal chemistry and pharmacognosy at Purdue University from 1989-90. From 1990 to 1992 he was a research associate at the Ben May Institute for Cancer Research, the University of Chicago. He was a Camille and Henry Dreyfus fellow at Southern Methodist University from 1992 to 1994. In August of 1994 he joined the faculty of Tennessee Tech University, where he has been ever since.

Dr. Swartling is a member of the American Chemical Society, the American Society of Biochemists and Molecular Biologists, the Tennessee Academy of Science, the International Solar Energy Society, the American Scientific Glassblowers Society, and the International Brotherhood of Real Bearded Santas.
