

Program Notes

Cha Cha Mi Mama

Gary Gibson

A cha-cha-cha is a dance developed by Cuban composer Enrique Jorrin in the 1950s. The name derives from the sound of the dancer's feet.

Movin' Out (Anthony's Song)

Billy Joel, arr. Gable

From Billy Joel's breakthrough 1977 album *The Stranger*, the track details Joel's view on the upward aspirations of middle-class New Yorkers. This arrangement was done by Dr. Christopher Gable, Director of Graduate Studies and Teaching Associate Professor of Music at the University of North Dakota.

Samba el Gato

Shelly Irvine

Called the "cat samba," Samba el Gato is a short and playful tune, its spirit likely modeled on its namesake.

Phantoms and Shadows

Doug Rosener

This is a Grade V winter drumline show. The show begins with the mallet instruments at the front of the group, known as the "front ensemble". This piece is a journey meant to evoke different atmospheres, culminating in an emphatic statement by both drums and mallets.
