Simona Barbu - Honor Strings Conductor

An international cellist and educator, Dr. Simona Barbu began her musical studies at age seven and gained public attention as a member of the leading string quartet of the Conservatory of Timisoara in her native Romania, where she made her solo debut in Tchaikovsky's Variations on a Rococo Theme with the conservatory's symphonic orchestra.

Barbu has traveled to Europe, Asia, and the United States as a soloist, chamber musician, clinician, and most recently she held residencies at conservatories and universities in China (Shanghai, Beijing, Guangzhou, Zhengzhou, Wenzhou and Hong Kong), in Hungary (Budapest and Kecskemet) and Romania (Timisoara and Cluj). She has also been an active orchestral musician, performing with Memphis Symphony Orchestra, South Dakota Symphony, Fargo Moorhead Symphony Orchestra, and serving as principal with the Eroica Ensemble in Memphis,

Starkville Symphony Orchestra, Greater Grand Forks Symphony Orchestra and Bismarck-Mandan Symphony Orchestra.

After graduating from her undergraduate as the Music Conservatory valedictorian from Lynn University in Florida, Dr. Barbu continued her graduate studies with a Master of Music in Cello Performance at Southern Methodist University under the tutelage of Nathaniel Rosen and Christopher Adkins. Subsequently, she earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Memphis where she studied with Leonardo Altino. Barbu has performed in master classes with Janos Starker, Lynn Harrell, Aldo Parisot, Pieter Wispelwey, Carol Ou, Timothy Eddy, Amit Peled and Yehuda Hanani.

Barbu served as a faculty member at Mississippi State University for four years (2007-2011), where she taught strings, coached string chamber ensembles, and conducted the symphonic orchestra. During the summers, she teaches and performs at the Summer Music Academy (Warsaw IN), at the International Music Camp (Dunseith, ND) and at the Medora Music Academy (Medora, ND).



Isaac Lovdahl - Mixed Honor Choir Conductor

Dr. Isaac Lovdahl is an award-winning composer, conductor, educator, and bass-baritone vocalist who serves as the Interim Director of Choral Activities at the University of North Dakota. He directed high school, church, and community choirs in Minnesota after graduating from Concordia College (Moorhead) in 2015, and recently completed a DMA in Choral Conducting at North Dakota State University where he was named the first ever Challey School of Music Choral Conducting Fellow. During his graduate studies, Dr. Lovdahl served as the Assistant Conductor of the Fargo-Moorhead Choral Artists. In 2021, he was named the winner of the Yale Glee Club Emerging Composer Competition and the Bellevue Chamber Chorus Emerging Composer Competition. In 2023, Dr. Lovdahl's piece "Freedom" earned second-place at the 43rd Annual Ithaca College Choral Composition Festival, his piece "The Orange (with Simple Gifts)" was premiered by the Young New Yorkers' Chorus treble ensemble after he was selected as a finalist in their composition competition, his piece "Though the great Waters

sleep" was named the winner in the choral music category for the inaugural Festival of New American Music (FeNAM) call for scores, he was named the first of three winners in The Singers - Minnesota Choral Artists' 20th anniversary season call for scores for his setting of William Blake's "The Lamb," and he earned third-place in The American prize for choral composition (shorter works). Most recently, Dr. Lovdahl was commissioned by the North Dakota Music Teachers Association to compose a new piece which will premiere at the state conference in August 2024. Along with his compositional activities, conducting, and teaching, Dr. Lovdahl has sung with a number of professional and semi-professional choral ensembles and keeps an active schedule of performing in various capacities. His original music can be found online through Graphite Publishing, Santa Barbara Music Publishing, NewMusicShelf, VocalEssence Music Press, MusicSpoke, and his own website: isaaclovdahl.com.



James Popejoy - Honor Band Conductor

Dr. James Popejoy is Director of Bands and Professor of Music at the University of North Dakota where he conducts the Wind Ensemble, University Band, and Chamber Players, and instructs graduate and undergraduate courses in conducting, instrumental literature, and jazz pedagogy. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Central Missouri State University; the Master of Arts in Conducting from the University of Iowa; and earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in Conducting with a minor in Jazz Studies from the University of North Texas. Among numerous honors, he has received two Outstanding Faculty awards from the UND Greek Council; a CMSU Distinguished Alumnus award; selection as Educator of the Year by the North Dakota Music Educators Association; two North Dakota Spirit Faculty Achievement Awards; a UND Outstanding Undergraduate Teaching Award; and the Citation of Excellence from the National Band Association. Dr. Popejoy regularly contributes to the "Teaching Music through

Performance in Band" series, having also served as a production assistant and performer on the recordings that accompany these resource materials. In his twenty-fouth year at UND, he served as Director of Bands and Percussion Studies at McLennan Community College in Texas for five years; was a public school music educator in Missouri for nine years; and has founded and conducted numerous community ensembles. Dr. Popejoy is a member of CBDNA, WASBE, NBA, NAfME, JEN, PAS, Manitoba Band Association, North Dakota National Band Association, and the North Dakota Music Educators Association, and has served on the Executive Boards for NDMEA, NDNBA and CBDNA. Past President for the North Central Division of the College Band Directors National Association, he maintains an active schedule as a jazz vibist, clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor.



Melanie Popejoy - Treble Honor Choir Conductor

Melanie Popejoy is Associate Director of Choral Activities at the University of North Dakota where she conducts the Allegro Choir and Vivo Chamber Ensemble, and instructs courses in music education methods, as well as supervising student teachers. In addition, she is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Grand Cities Children's Choir, serving as conductor of the elite Primo Voce choir. She holds the Bachelor of Music Education degree and the Master of Arts degree in Music Education from Central Missouri State University, and has taught in Missouri, lowa, Kansas, and Texas prior to coming to North Dakota. In her 40 years of teaching, Mrs. Popejoy has taught at the elementary, middle school, high school, and collegiate levels. She has conducted numerous honor and festival ensembles, including the North Dakota ACDA JH/MS Mixed All-State Choir, and the Missouri Choral Directors Association 9-10 Honor Choir.

Mrs. Popejoy has earned numerous teaching awards throughout her career, including the Community Leadership Award from the North Dakota Chamber of Commerce; Wal-Mart/Sam's Club Teacher of the Year; the Distinguished Alumnus Award from CMSU; an Athena Award for Professional Excellence and Community Leadership; the Phenomenal Woman Award from UND Multicultural Student Services; and selection as the North Dakota Music Educator of The Year and Choral Director of the Year. She has been nominated twice for a the UND Undergraduate Teaching Award. Her Waco Girls Choir was selected to perform at the 1997 Texas Music Educators Association Conference, while her Grand Cities Children's Choir has presented concerts at the 2003 North Dakota Music Educators Association Conference, the 2006 American Choral Directors Association North Central Conference, the 2009 North Dakota ACDA Conference, and in 2020 at Carnegie Hall. The UND Vivo Chamber Ensemble was selected to present featured performances at the 2015 and 2019 ND-ACDA Conferences.

THE UNIVERSITY

The University of North Dakota is the state's most comprehensive research university and the primary center for professional education and training. Founded six years prior to statehood by the Dakota Territorial Assembly in 1883, UND has remained a university with a strong liberal arts foundation, surrounded by a variety of professional and specialized programs. One of only 47 public universities in the nation with both accredited graduate schools of law and medicine, UND is admired for its spacious, beautiful campus, extensive resources, and an international reputation for its academic and research programs. Odegard School of Aerospace Sciences; College of Arts & Sciences; College of Business & Public Administration; School of Entrepreneurship; College of Education & Human Development; College of Engineering & Mines; School of Graduate Studies; School of Law; School of Medicine & Health Sciences; and the College of Nursing & Professional Disciplines. The Graduate School offers master's degrees in 56 fields, doctoral degrees in 29 fields, and the Specialist Diploma. Forty-six percent of the students who attend UND come from North Dakota, while the rest represent all other states, eight Canadian provinces, and more than 50 nations.

THE DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

The University of North Dakota Department of Music offers a wide array of musical opportunities for its students, the university, and a growing audience for the arts throughout the region. Students may pursue the Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education, Music Performance, or Music Therapy; the Bachelor of Arts in Music; the Master of Music degree in Music Education, Performance and Pedagogy, Conducting, and Composition; and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Music Education. Music graduates have enjoyed outstanding success in teaching and performance careers regionally, nationally and internationally.
