PROGRAM NOTES

Charanga is a style of salsa dancing that was popular from the 1920s through the 1970s. In this style of Latin music, the flute acted as the lead solo instrument rather than a set of bongos, which is more typical in salsa music. This music is high energy and full of complicated riffs. Michael Colquhoun wrote this work for a National Flute Association competition in 1993 and dedicated it to all the great Latin charanga flutists.

Anna Bon di Venezia is one of a small number of women composers from the baroque era who have music that has survived to modern day. She spent most of her life in Italy but lived and worked in the Court Bayreuth in Germany, which was a cultural center of her time. It was during this time that she wrote and dedicated six flute sonatas, including *Sonata IV in D Major*, to Margrave Fridrich of Brandenburg Kulmbach, who led the court that Bon was a part of. Anna Bon was sixteen at the time of writing these sonatas.

Hall of Ghosts was composed in April of 2020. It was inspired by the sounds of piccoloist Gudrun Hinze playing alone in an empty chamber music hall. The piece explores the memories trapped in this empty hall, the passage of time, and music striving to be heard. The composer poignantly points out in her program notes that "You can decide through your interpretation on who wins. The music? Or the ghosts?"

Deuxième Sonate or Flute Sonata No. 2 was written in 1925 and dedicated to Marcel Moyse. In his compositions, Phillipe Gaubert worked to reframe the flute from a flashy virtuosic instrument to one of deep expression through tone. This sonata showcases those ideas through sudden dynamic shifts and incredibly long phrasing. Gaubert's most lasting legacy is the pedagogical book written in collaboration with his teacher Paul Taffanel, Méthode Compléte de Flûte.

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
