UND Music Department Applied Final Jury Exam Policy

Applied Music Individual Lesson Jury

- Applied final exams (juries) are mandatory for all students enrolled in the applied lessons, except for composition or conducting.
 - a) Participation in jury evaluations is a required task for faculty teaching applied lessons (except for faculty teaching composition or conducting). Other faculty may serve if needed and invited, subject to their voluntary concurrence.
 - b) It is recommended that the final jury exam normally contribute between 10% and 30% toward the total course grade.
- 2. Applied final jury exams will be administered during the University's scheduled final exam week.
 - a) The department chair will set the jury schedule on consistent days of finals week (normally Monday-Wednesday). Groups scheduled may include:
 - Woodwinds
 - ii. Brass & Percussion
 - iii. Piano
 - iv. Voice
 - v. All strings including guitar.
 - b) Day and time of each semester's jury schedule will rotate systematically among instrument/voice groups. The jury schedule will be determined at least one year in advance.
 - c) Care will be taken to ensure that students accompanying other juries will not be excessively burdened on the day of their own jury, nor that they will miss scheduled accompaniment.
- 3. A minimum panel size of 3 faculty is required for all instrument/voice groups.
 - a) Grades of all panel members will be averaged to formulate the final grade.
 - b) Individual panel members' comments and scores, plus the average jury grade must be filed as required by existing department policy: one copy each to the student, the student's office file, and the instructor.
- 4. Failure to follow this jury policy will be noted in the faculty member's annual review, as well as failure to follow department, college and university policies relevant to same.
- 5. If a student has a required degree recital in the second half of the semester, its jury may at the discretion of the instructor constitute and substitute for a final jury exam. If a student does an optional recital or any recital in the first half of the semester, they must do a final jury exam.
- 6. Individual performance areas may design their own forms for jury evaluation, either electronic or on paper, as long as official policies are observed. A template for an online form is available on request. The following information is required on any such form: Student Name, Date, Semester, Type of Jury (Pre-Recital, Final Exam), Course Number, Instrument or Voice, Evaluator.
